Sexual and reproductive health and rights advocate, sex educator, activist. Cofounder and (between 2014 and 2017) member of Polish Youth Group Te Tematy (That Subject), member of Ponton Group of Sex Educators since 2015. A guest NGO observer of the Health Committee in the Polish Parliament in 2016 and of the Sexuality Education Committee in 2020. Speaker at numerous national conferences and international events. Coordinator of ASTRA Network, the biggest Central and Eastern European Network for Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights since 2019. In her work, Antonina monitors the political, legal and social situations of different countries of the region, focusing mainly on access to sexual education, contraception and abortion, as well as on sexual and reproductive health and rights in general. Recommendations that she helped to develop were included in a UN Report of the Special Rapporteur on the Situation of Women Human Rights Defenders.
